



but they do have to improve the lives of children and families in your community.


Also, please continue to do everything that you can to grow your clubs. As we all know, the more members we have = the more hands for service, and of course **SERVICE** is what we do.

DAY SEVEN







Using a few words to express how I feel after this day is truly complicated. I feel a mixture of emotions going from pride to delight!

Proud of the unbelievable team who managed the arrival of buses filled with fifty-five (55) children to be dressed repeatedly without complaining, with unbelievable energy and smiles. Sad because some children could not show for several reasons.

Happy at the smiles and the thank you messages coming in.

Touched by the many drawings done by the children to thank us, by their little worried voices asking how much it will cost, knowing that their parents do not have much money, and finally, their large smiles when we tell them that it's a gift...

I have seen a little boy wearing the pink spangled sneakers of his sister (because when you don't have money, you pass the clothes from one child to the other), filled with wonder for his brandnew boots, boots just for him for the first time in his life. \square

I have seen older brothers/sisters caring for their little brothers and sisters with love and goodwill because, in those complex families, the oldest children have no choice but to grow up faster than expected ... \heartsuit

I have seen volunteers filled with emotions, even tears, when they realised the amplitude of poverty existing at our doors \bigcirc Cont'd.....

KIWANIS CHILDREN'S FUND DONATES GRANT TO EC&C DISTRICT FOR YOUTH LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Anthony Haile, Governor for EC&C District 2022-2023, always said "SLPs are our future". It is no wonder that with an invitation from the Kiwanis Children's Fund to apply for a grant, the recipients would be SLPs. The Kiwanis Children's Fund (KCF) grant together with a grant from the district, would facilitate a project in the category of Youth Leadership Development.

The purpose of the project was to provide additional leadership training for the Service Leadership Program (SLP) members. This training was not a part of their regular officers' training but one which gave them insights into other areas of leadership. High school and college students preparing to enter the workforce are extremely interested in any opportunities for higher learning and personal development. In this regard, the project was directed at Key Club and Circle K International (CKI) members.

The one-day seminar held on November 4, 2023, saw presentations on Report Writing, Etiquette Deportment, Youth Protection, Kiwanis Children's Fund,

and Conflict Resolution/Problem Solving. The project was promoted through flyers, invitations, phone calls, and posts on social media. Key Club and CKI members attended both in-person and online using the Zoom Kiwanians from across the District also platform. supported the project. Registration indicated that there were 117 SLPs, 23 Kiwanians, and 2 Staff Advisors in-person and 120 in total on Zoom. The physical location was adequate for the number of in-person attendees. The Kiwanis branding was evident from the pull-up banners in the room and feather banners on the outside.



KIWANIS SIGNATURE PROJECT CONTEST



The contest opens January 2, 2024.

Signature projects show the impact a Kiwanis club can have on a community. From playgrounds and parks to festivals and fundraisers, signature projects are the hallmarks of what Kiwanis clubs are known for in their communities.

Kiwanis International will host the eighth annual Signature Project Recognition Program for clubs and districts in 2024. Clubs with 27 members or fewer will be judged in the Group I category. Clubs with 28 members or more will be judged in Group II category. Each group will be judged separately and the top 10 finalists will be determined for each group. The top three selections from each group will be recognized as the gold, silver and bronze winners at the 2024 Kiwanis International Convention.

Clubs should submit their project details using the online contest form found below on this page or sent to you from your district leadership. Each club's entry will be sent to their district for judging and selection of their Group I and/ or Group II projects that will be entered into the 2024 Signature Project Contest.

The Kiwanis International Board Committee on Service and Partnerships will review qualifying submissions and select the finalists. Finalists will be recognized at the 2024 Kiwanis Convention where the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners for each group will be announced and recognized at the Signature Project breakfast. Finalists will be notified of their selection in time to take advantage of any discounted early registration rates.

What is a signature project?

Think about what your Kiwanis club is known for in your community. It can be a service project or a fundraiser. Signature projects:

- ◆ Are recurring. (Note: A new project can qualify as a signature project if the intent is to continue the project.)
- ♦ Enhance the Kiwanis image.
- ♦ Demonstrate significant impact on the community in terms of monies raised or children served.
- ♦ Strengthen membership and partnership opportunities.

While the district should determine how to select its club-level Group I and Group II submissions, the project should follow the outlined criteria.




