



My sincere thank you to all the wonderful Kiwanians who have made us feel so welcome during our travels.



HISTORY OF THE KIWANIS ORGANIZATION

Kiwanis International is celebrating its 109th Anniversary - January 21, 2024.

Kiwanis International was founded in 1915 in Detroit, Michigan, U.S. The organization was originally called the "Supreme Lodge Benevolent Order of Brothers". A year later, the name changed to Kiwanis, which was selected by the organization's founders (Joseph C. Prance and Allen S. Browne) based on their understanding that the word was





translatable to "we build" from the Algonquian Native American language family. That same year, Kiwanis became an international organization with the founding of the Kiwanis Club of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

(Photo at left) - Just over 107 years ago in November 1916, the Kiwanis Club of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada received their Club Charter, making it the first Canadian and International club. They celebrated at the Royal Connaught Hotel in mid-January.

Initially focused on business networking, the organization changed its focus to service in 1919 — specifically service to children. Kiwanis limited its membership to the United States and Canada until 1962, when worldwide expansion was approved. Since then, Kiwanis has spread across the globe.

In May 1983, the Kiwanis International Board officially adopted the Kiwanianne Club Program as an optional activity for all Kiwanis Clubs to enable women to work effectively with Kiwanis Clubs in carrying out the objectives, community service projects, and activities of the movement.

On July 7, 1987, at the annual Kiwanis International convention in Washington, DC, the Kiwanis International Constitution and Bylaws, were amended to allow women into the Kiwanis movement worldwide. The first clubs to admit women into the organization were the Kiwanis Club of Great Neck, New York, and the Kiwanis Club of Cheyenne Mountain, Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Kiwanis International is headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, United States, and today there are Kiwanis clubs in nearly 80 nations and geographic locations.

Collaborative Effort Aims to Enhance Fine Motor Skills and Sensory Processing for Students

In a renewed commitment to community well-being, Ms. Meredith Atwood, President of the Kiwanis Club of South Eleuthera, has once again spearheaded a partnership with Sheila Allen, an Occupational Therapist with over 40 years of experience specializing in young children. The collaborative effort recently made its mark at Rock Sound Primary School, where Principal Mrs. Mechelle Walker expressed heartfelt gratitude for the support received from Ms. Atwood, Kiwanis Club of South Eleuthera, and Sheila Allen.

During the visit to Rock Sound Primary School, Mrs. Walker commended the joint initiative, highlighting the importance of addressing fine motor skills, sensory processing, and attention span development in young students. "We understand the importance of these aspects, and we want all of our students to grow and be successful. If an Occupational Therapist can help bridge the gap, then we are very grateful for that assistance," Mrs. Walker remarked.

The collaboration involves Ms. Atwood, Kiwanis Club of South Eleuthera, and Sheila Allen working closely with teachers, aiming to provide them with the tools and knowledge to enhance the learning experience for their students. Recognizing the crucial role that teachers play in the lives of children, especially in their formative years, Ms. Allen is passionate about supporting educators in fostering optimal growth and development.

A meeting, attended by eight teachers and several Kiwanis Club of South Eleuthera members, served as the platform to introduce Sheila Allen and discuss the collaborative efforts underway. Ms. Allen shared insights into her extensive experience working with children and expressed enthusiasm for an upcoming pilot program developed in conjunction with the Kiwanis Club of South Eleuthera. The pilot program is set to support teachers and aides in both public

Dr. John Button - Past International President

Dr. John Button, former President of Kiwanis International, passed away on June 15, 2020. "Dr. John", as he was so fondly called, was a dedicated physician, husband to Debbie, friend to many, and a Kiwanis member whose leadership was a beacon of hope that included a positive attitude to grow Kiwanis spirit and membership. He is greatly missed. The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada approved a new scholarship fund for Canadian Key Club and Circle K members. The scholarship program is offered annually for a 10-year term (2022 to 2031). The scholarship amount is \$5,000 each. Eligible programs are:

- ♦ Bachelor of Science •
- ♦ Medical Degree •
- ◊ Nursing ·
- ♦ Some examples include Physician, Nursing, Medical Research, Pharmacist

Four Scholarships have now been awarded, including:

- ♦ Two for students taking a Bachelor of Science degree with plans to attend medical school •
- Degree in biochemistry ·
- Dermatologist.

Our goal is to raise \$100,000 over the next 2 to 3 years to cover the cost of the scholarship. Tax receipts will be provided to all donors.

The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada has agreed to match the scholarship fund (up to \$5,000) to maintain \$10,000 per year. This will cover the cost of the scholarship until all funds are raised to cover the total cost.
